# Student Mobility and The Internationalization of Higher Education

- The term "internationally mobile students" refers to
- students who have crossed a national border to study,
- or students who are enrolled in a distance learning programme abroad.
- These students are not residents or citizens of the country where they study.
- Internationally mobile students are a sub-group of "foreign students", a category that includes those who have permanent residency in the host country.
- For this reason, the number of foreign students, globally, tends to be higher.









In the 2013/14 academic year, 10,821 students from Turkey were studying in the United States (down 4.1% from the previous year). Turkey is the eleventh leading place of origin for students coming to the United States.

# China's outbound student

- 339,600 Chinese students studied abroad in 2012,
  - an increase of 17% over the previous year.
- In 2013, it is estimated that this figure rose to 450,000.
- Furthermore, China continues to dominate the foreign student market in the US, Canada, and Australia.
